Visit a Woodland

When you get home, write a sentence or two, on a bit of scrap paper about your experience. An example might be: "It was easier to breathe in the woods- I felt so relaxed." If you identified species tell us which ones- include your name and year group on the slip of paper. Bring in on April 21st.

Woodland Art or Poetry

Still inspired by your visit with the trees- use your imagination to create a picture using natural items to reflect your experience. Or if words are your preferred medium- write a poem or story. Take a picture or bring in your creation on April 21st to be part of a nature display.
