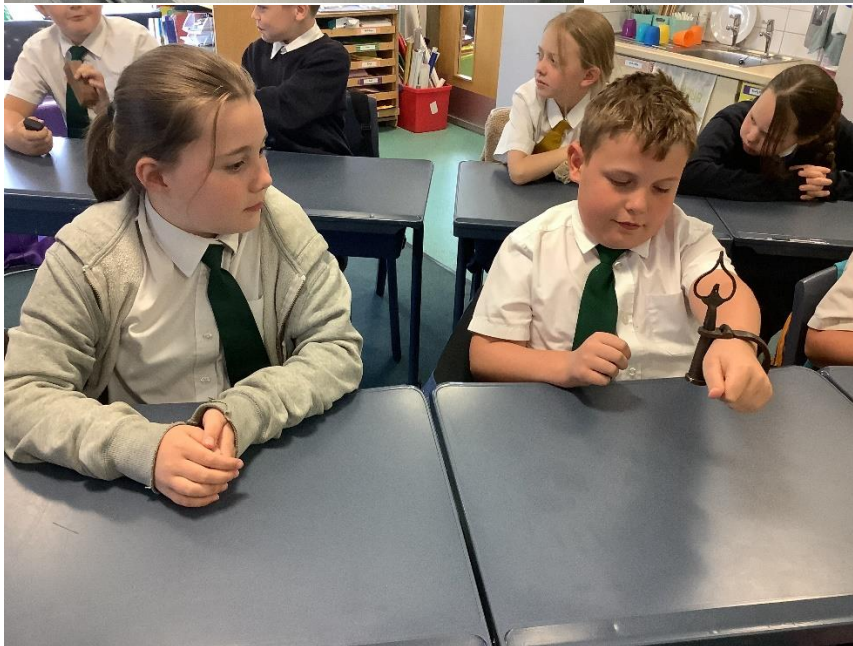
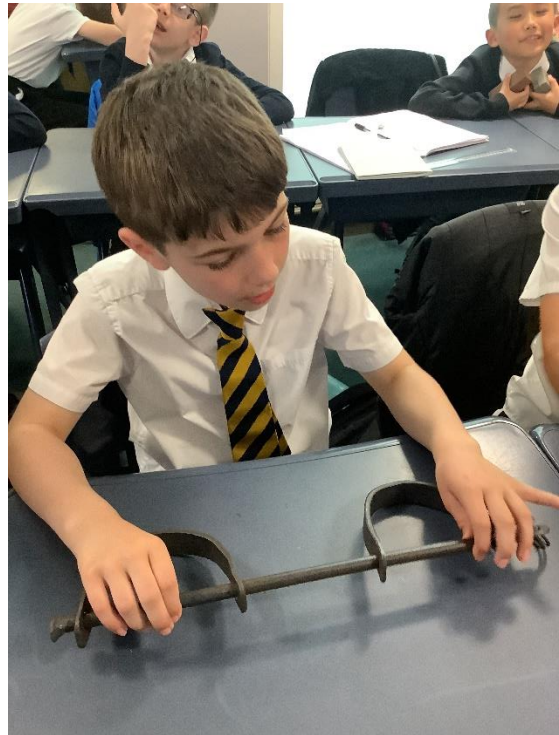




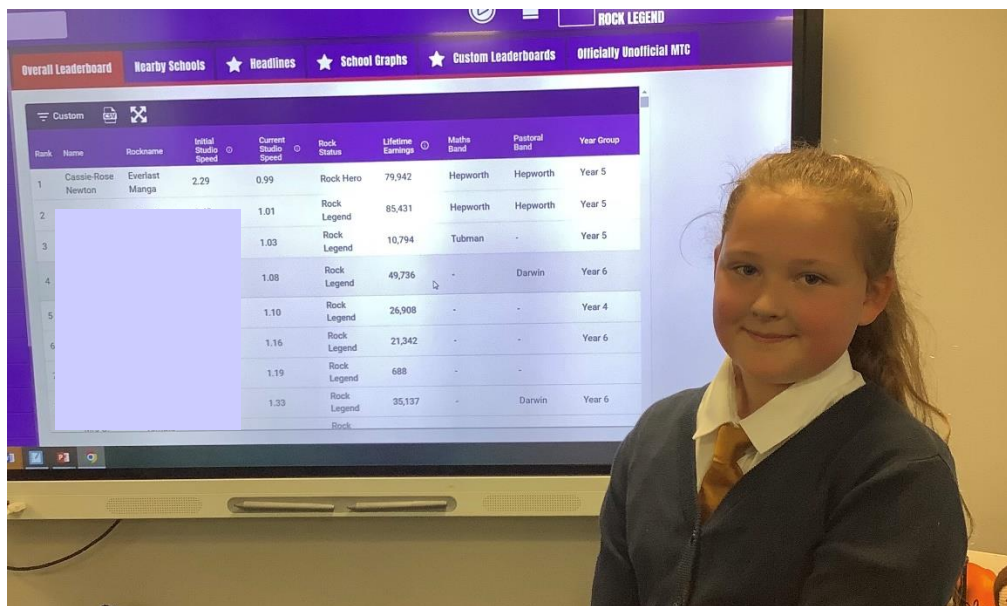
Combining DT skills and a bit of Georgian fun at the end of our French Revolution Unit in history, these guys certainly look stunning in their wigs and Napoleon hat!

Recorders CAN sound nice! We worked hard to practice until we all had the tune and rhythm to play to a jazz backing track. Some of us were quite good at improvising too!

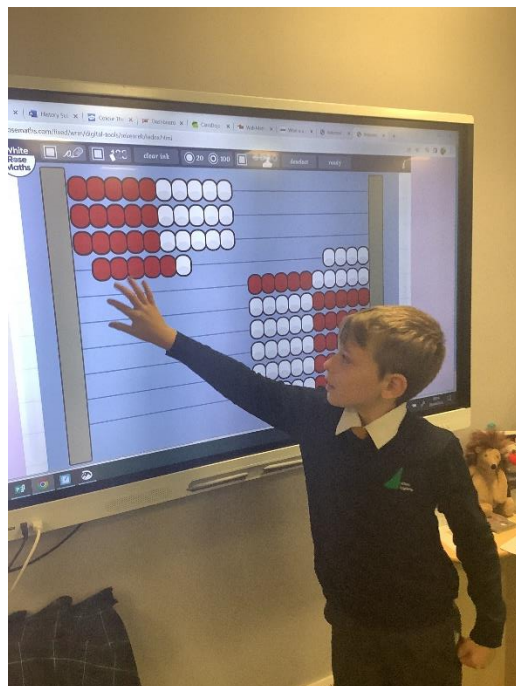


Our Reading Emporium – the perfect place to chill and read... one of our favourite times of day is ‘Reading for Pleasure’ time, just after lunch!
