Eco Club News

Nelson has begun the process of gaining the internationally recognized Eco-Schools Green Flag accreditation. Classes from Reception to Year 6 have elected eco-warriors to help bring about positive eco-based changes at the school.

A survey was issued to each class, and there were three areas in which the students feel very passionate about. These were cutting down on litter, increasing habitats for animals, and growing plants at the school and abroad. The eco-committee is drawing up their action plans to achieve these goals. Though we may not be able to see completion of all of these by the end of this school year, watch out for some incredible improvements in future terms.

Our first school wide activity is to acknowledging World Rainforest Day in June. This day is designed to bring awareness to the world's rapidly declining rainforests. Though this day is on the Tuesday, we will be celebrating on Friday, June 25th with a non-uniform day. Children will be encouraged to "Go Green" by wearing green clothes, or clothes decorated with a rainforest animal, trees or plants. As with all non-uniform days, children can choose to still wear their uniform. We will be taking donations- there will be no set amount, nor is it mandatory; but the proceeds we raise will be divided between Just one Tree Charity (which plants trees around the world) and a wildlife camera for the school. In addition, we are going to encourage eco-friendly lunches such as food in re-usable containers or local produce with less travel miles. The children may also participate in a variety of "green" activities on the day.
