








Key Vocab	Definition
Coronation	The act or ceremony of crowning a king, queen or other sovereign.
Reign	The time period during which a sovereign occupies the throne.
Monarch	A hereditary sovereign, as a king, queen, or emperor.
Palace	The official residence of a king, queen, bishop, or other sovereign.
Exhibition	A public display of the work of artists, the products of farms or factories, the skills of performers, or objects of general interest.
Manufacturing	The making of goods or wares by manual labour or by machinery, especially on a large scale.
Regent	A person who exercises the ruling power in a kingdom during the minority, absence or disability of the sovereign.
Prince Regent	A prince who is regent of a country.
Prince Albert	The husband of Queen Victoria.
Balmoral	Balmoral Castle is a large estate house in Royal Deeside, Aberdeenshire, Scotland, currently owned by Queen Elizabeth II.

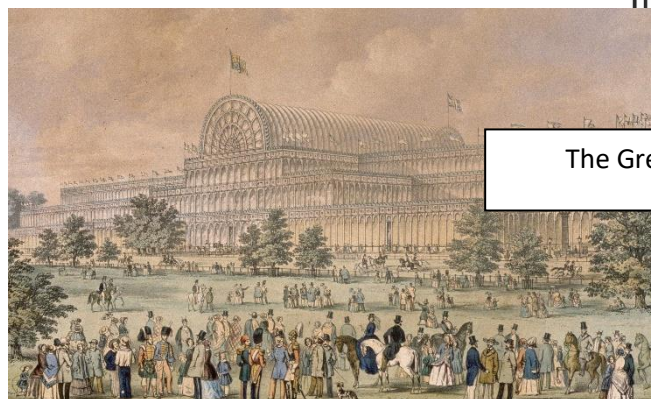
