
Beliefs and Practices Religion: Judaism

Jews believe that there is one God who not only created the world, but with whom every Jew can have a personal and individual relationship.



Covenant	Agreement/promise
Shema	One of the most important Jewish prayers
Mezuzah	Hebrew 'doorpost' – shema rolled inside a metal case
Descendants	Children and children's children etc
commandments	Set of principles from God
Torah scroll	Five books of Abraham kept in Ark
Ner Tamid	Ever-burning lamp
Synagogue	Jewish place of worship



The Tefillin are strapped to the left arm and forehead. It is a constant reminder that God is in their mind and their heart.

The mezuzah is kept on the doorpost of the front door, It contains the shema prayer.



Jewish history begins with the covenant (agreement/promise) between God and **Abraham** around 1812 BC and **Abraham** is considered the founder of Judaism. Genesis 17: 1-7.


